A huge 52" diameter black oak tree blew down with tremendous impact against the roof, followed by a big poplar and a second oak.

"Then all of a sudden I saw the tree fall. I was so scared I hit the floor. Then my husband hit the floor. If it hadn't been a log home, it would have squashed us flat," Mrs. Neely told *The Charleston Gazette*. "I'm just happy we weren't hurt."

While the fallen trees had knocked holes in the roof, cracked a ridge beam and emptied shelves in the bathroom, the rest of the home and furnishings—even the family china—were not damaged. The ALSI home had withstood a major impact and was easily repaired—a testimony to superior engineering and the structural integrity of ALSI's timber frame roof design.

"A conventional wood frame structure probably would have collapsed like a cardboard box," notes ALSI vice president of sales, Gary Jarrell.
